Dear Parents,

We are excited to offer you the opportunity to have your child participate in our after-school learning program. The program is funded by federal education dollars, and is offered to you free of charge.

Your child will have the opportunity to attend 40 hours of after-school instruction in reading and/or math. The sessions will be held in your child's school, and the instructors will be teachers from the school. The length and number of sessions per week will be determined through mutual agreement of the provider and the program teachers.

Teachers will use materials designed by The Princeton Review called *SideStreets*. Students will be provided with textbooks, skills books, and journals. Parent guides for the *SideStreets* program will also be available.

## FACE Program Highlights

- ★ Supplemental Educational Services approved provider for grades 3-8
- ★ Program offered after school on-site using teachers from your child's school at no cost to parents
- ★ 40 hours of intervention instruction of reading and/or math for qualified students
- ★ *SideStreets* instructional materials including Student Pack, Parent Guides, Math Manipulatives, Leveled Readers, and Flash Cards
- ★ Reports on your child's progress sent home regularly
- ★ Children who successfully complete the SES program may be eligible to enter a drawing for a \$2,500 college scholarship

## Frequently Asked Questions

**How do I know if my child is eligible for this program?** Most likely, your child is eligible because you received this information, but you can check with the school office to be sure.

**How do I enroll my child for the FACE Program?** You should have received enrollment information with this brochure. Check with the school office if you are not sure.

**Will my child's regular classroom teacher be the teacher for the FACE after-school program?** It's possible your child may have his/her classroom teacher. However, in most cases, the teacher in the after-school program will be another teacher from your child's school.

**How often will my child meet for this program?** The daily and weekly schedule will be determined by FACE and the after-school teacher. The program includes 40 hours of after-school instruction throughout the school year.

**How many students will be in the after-school sessions with my child?** The program is designed to have 12 children with each after-school teacher.

**What subjects are included in the FACE program?** The program includes instruction in reading and math using the *SideStreets* reading and math materials.

**Is transportation provided?** Your child will go to school as he/she usually does. Following the after-school session, transportation is the parent's responsibility.

**How will I know how my child is doing?** Your child's after-school teacher will provide you with regular progress reports.

**Who do I call if I have questions?** Check your enrollment information for the contact person regarding your school's SES Programs.
